We invite you to join us in Lisburn City Library on Tuesday 19th May to enjoy an informative talk on the life and works of Robert Burns, presented by George Holmes, former Chief Executive of the Ulster-Scots Agency. Born in 1759 in Scotland, the son of a poor farmer, the appeal of Robert Burns goes far beyond his native land, with songs like “Auld Lang Syne,” “Ye Banks and Braes O’Bonnie Doon,” and “My Luve’s Like a Red Red Rose” known throughout the world. He died in 1796 due to a rheumatic heart condition, but a year before dying told his wife, “Ay, Jean, they’ll think more of me a hundred years after this,” a prophecy that was to be fulfilled.
