Public Liability Insurance - Renewal 2015-16

The current period of insurance expires on 31 March and Member Societies and should arrange to renew their cover before that date.

Despite reminders, some Societies have not renewed membership which was due on 1 October 2014. These societies have not been covered by Federation Insurance since then. Should a member or visitor be injured at any of its meetings or trips then the individual members of the society, and/or its management committee, may be individually liable for any compensation awarded by the courts in the absence of the insurance cover.

Joint Federation Trips to Devon & Cornwall – April 2015

The joint trip to Devon and Cornwall 13th to 17th April has been oversubscribed. The places were all filled within 24 hours of the notice being issued. This demonstrates the popularity of this annual joint event. The Federations are considering revised arrangements for promoting future trips to ensure that, so far as possible, as many society members and individual members have an equal opportunity to register an interest.

Regional Seminars

The Executive Committee is planning a series of regional seminars based on the major towns. Although planning is at an early stage these are likely to include Armagh, Coleraine, Omagh, Belfast and Letterkenny. The seminars will focus initially on 'How to' topics designed to provide hands-on experience for Societies to help them to improve communication skills and project activities. Two initial topics are social media (including Facebook and Twitter) and heritage trails. More information later.

Another idea, raised at the AGM in November last, was to bring societies together to share their experience in researching and publicising local history, involving their members and their communities more effectively, as well as describing their successes and failures and the challenges and opportunities encountered etc. The aim would be to help identify good practice and generate ideas and perhaps find ways of practical co-operation between societies through reciprocal visits and perhaps shared projects. This approach got a good welcome and the Executive Committee will develop it further in the course of the year. We will probably be seeking some initial input from societies to help with the planning. More information later

Autumn Seminar

The Ulster History Trust is planning a seminar in Monaghan on 3 October 2015 on a number of WW1-related topics including its impact on the border counties and the role of women in the conflict. More information later.

European Battlefields Visit 2016

The Joint FULS/FHLS committee is planning to organise a four/five day joint event to be based in the Irish College in Leuven, which can arrange the trips to the chosen battlefields. Alternative providers are being considered. More information later.

A History of Women in Northern Ireland in People and Places

Professor Mary O'Dowd of the School of History and Anthropology, Queen's University Belfast is compiling an app and linked website, on sites and people related to the history of women in Northern Ireland. She is looking for assistance from local history societies to identify sites and people to include in the project.
